#### HIGHLIGHTS

On December 28<sup>th</sup>, a felonious assault investigation ended with the arrest of two area men. A 23-year-old Howard City man and a 23-year-old Morley man shot at a home in the 18000 block of west Church Road from a moving vehicle. Deputies did engage in a pursuit but were not able to apprehend the suspect. A short time later, a domestic call was reported on north Federal Road and it was determined the suspect in the domestic was the subject wanted in connection with the shooting. As the investigation progressed, it was believed the suspect may head to various homes in the Village and those homes were surveilled. The suspect was eventually taken into custody without incident. A search of a nearby home led to the identification of a second suspect and evidence. The shooting was not a random event so the likelihood of unrelated individual being harmed was extremely low. Fortunately, the time of day of the occurrence also aided in keeping the public out of harm's way.
